## PROCLAMATION

by

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HONOURABLE EMMERSON DAMBUDZO MNANGAGWA, Grand Commander of the Zimbabwe Order of Merit, President of Zimbabwe and Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Forces of Zimbabwe.

WHEREAS the Zimbabwe Electoral Commission, after delimiting the wards and constituencies into which Zimbabwe is to be divided, submitted to the President, in accordance with section 161(7) of the Constitution, a preliminary delimitation report containing—

- (a) a list of the wards and constituencies, with the names assigned to each and a description of their boundaries;
- (b) a map or maps showing the wards and constituencies; and
- (c) any further information or particulars which the Commission considers necessary;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section 110(1)(c) of the Constitution the President has power to summon the National Assembly, the Senate or Parliament “to an extraordinary sitting to conduct special business”;

AND WHEREAS by the terms of section 161(7) of the Constitution to the President must cause the preliminary delimitation report to be laid before Parliament within seven days of receiving it:

NOW, THEREFORE, under and by virtue of the powers vested in the President as afore said, and as resolved by Parliament, I do by this my Proclamation fix—

- (a) nine o’clock on Friday the 6th January, 2022, as the time from which and date on which the Parliament shall convene for the purpose of the laying before it of the preliminary delimitation report;
- (a) Parliament Building, Harare, as the place for the sitting of Parliament for that purpose.
